Two-Handed Tactile

· Gora	Close Vision	
1.	Print on Palm	Used briefly to clarify a word, number, symbol or detail
2.	One-Handed Tactile	Used by consumers who are very skilled at tactile communication
3.	Close Vision	Involves greatly reducing your signing space
4.	Two-Handed Tactile	Used when seeking fuller tactile picture of a signed message
5.	Close Vision and Tra	cking Used by persons with usable residual vision
6.	Two-Handed Tactile	Used by persons just learning tactile sign
7.	Print-on-Palm	Used in combination with both tactile modes
8.	Close Vision	Involves reducing your rate of interpreting, particularly the speed
	of fingerspelling	
9.	Tracking	Often used as a transitional mode from visual to tactile
	communication	
10.	Close Vision	Only method that might be used while seated at a distance from
	the consumer.
