2. _____ Used by consumers who are very skilled at tactile communication
3. _____ Involves greatly reducing your signing space
4. _____ Used when seeking fuller tactile picture of a signed message
5. _____ and _____ Used by consumers with usable residual vision
6. _____ Used by consumers just learning tactile sign
7. _____ Used in combination with both tactile modes
8. _____ Involves reducing your rate of interpreting, particularly the speed of fingerspelling
9. _____ Often used as a transitional mode from visual to tactile communication
10. _____ Only method that might be used while seated at a distance from the consumer.
